
God's Hand in Restoring Lives 5/18/2025

Discuss

- •Compare Naaman's **expectation** in verse 11 with what actually happened.
- •Naaman expected Elisha to do something dramatic. Instead, he was given a simple command. What does this teach us about how God works?
- •If Naaman's servants had not intervened, he might not have been healed. How might we miss God's work in our lives when we expect Him to work a certain way?



- •Thank God for answers to prayer in your family's life. Tell Him how grateful you are for dealing with both simple and difficult needs.
- •Tell the Lord that you are trusting Him to take care of your problems in even simple ways that you might not expect.
- Ask God to help you not to miss His working in your life just because you expect a certain outcome.
- Pray for people you know who need God to work in their lives. Pray that they will be ready to receive God's answers.
