## Discuss

- Paul says to consider others better than yourselves. What is the difference between *thinking less of yourself* and *thinking of yourself less*?
- How would it make you feel if someone put your needs ahead of your own in a humble way?
- What does it look like to “value others above yourselves” in everyday life—at school, work, or in our home? Why is that often hard to do?
- What’s one small way you can think of someone else’s needs this week—without waiting to be asked? How would that make a difference in your relationship?
