- •What kinds of "weapons" do we "pull out" when we approach a reconciliation? How might we try to make it a confrontation instead of a reconciliation?
- •In Jacob and Esau's culture, prostration on the ground was a sign of a humble approach. How can we demonstrate a humble approach to a confrontation?

- •Ask God to show you any grudges you might be holding against someone.
